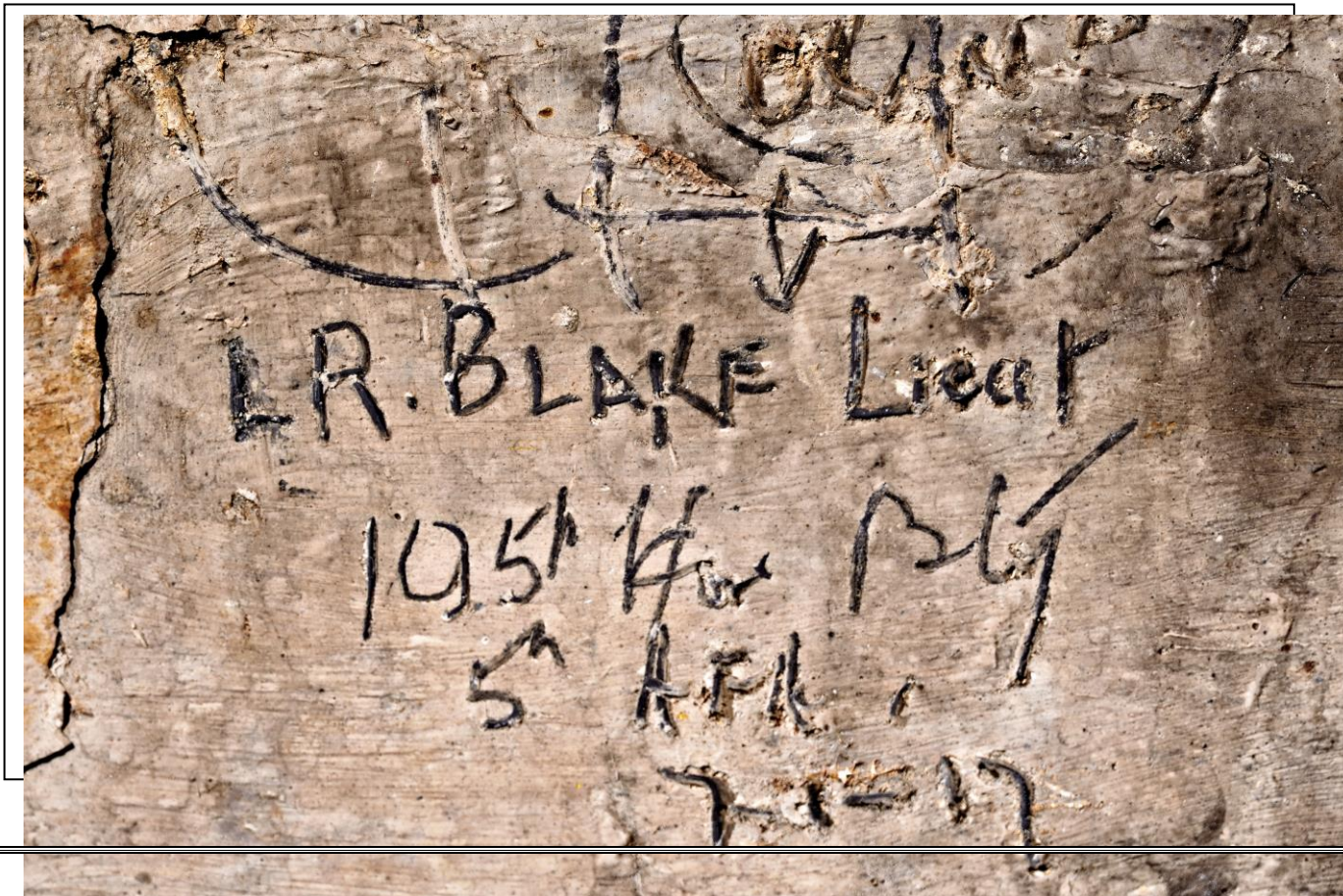

Biographie

Gilles Prilaux

Leslie Russel Blake est né le 28 octobre 1890 à Hawthorn, banlieue de Melbourne, dans l'État de Victoria. Après la mort prématurée de ses parents, en 1892 et en 1897, il a été élevé par sa tante, Jane Deazeley dans l'État du Queensland. Il passera sa scolarité à Brisbane et à l'Université de Sydney, avant d'être nommé expert en géologie dans le département des mines de Queensland. Il passera alors la plupart de son temps à explorer les vastes domaines du Queensland et les importants secteurs aurifères de la région de Gympie. En 1911, il intègre l'équipe de Douglas Mawson qui entreprend une expédition en Antarctique dans le but d'étudier et de cartographier l'Île de Macquarie. Les résultats des travaux menés pendant plus de deux années sur cette Île, dans des conditions extrêmement difficiles, vaudra à une partie de l'équipe, de recevoir des mains du roi Georges V la médaille polaire en argent qui est une très haute distinction qui récompense les hommes qui ont mené des travaux d'études ou de recherches en Antarctique. Depuis sa création en 1857, seules 245 médailles polaires en argent ont été délivrées. Dès son retour en 1914, il est sollicité par Sir Ernest Shackleton, considéré aujourd'hui comme l'une des grandes figures des périodes héroïques des explorations en Antarctique, pour rejoindre l'Expédition Impériale Trans-Antarctique 1914/1916, proposition que refusera Blake pour servir son pays en entrant dans l'armée. Il fera plusieurs tentatives pour s'engager mais sera déclaré à chaque fois inapte au combat, mais après une brève période passée à l'hôpital, il nira par être enrôlé dans l'artillerie le 4 août 1915. 98 Inrap · Rapport de sondage archéologique Somme, Naours, Cité souterraine - Gilles Prilaux : Les traces de la Grande Guerre Ses capacités et ses compétences sont rapidement reconnues et il est promu sergent à peine trois mois après son engagement avec une immersion sur le terrain quatre mois plus tard le 12 mars 1916. Avant de partir servir au Moyen-Orient et en France, il déclarera sa amme à sa ancée Frances Eileen Elliott. Le 25 novembre 1916, la Gazette de Londres annonce la remise au Lieutenant Leslie Russel Blake de la Military Cross, qui est une des plus hautes distinctions militaires, créée par le roi Georges V le 28 décembre 1915. La citation officielle est assez peu loquace, en revanche le rapport de la division australienne est plus détaillé et les états de services qui ont amené à cette récompense rapportent que « *Le Lieutenant Leslie Russel Blake, 105^{ème} batterie d'obusier de la 5^{ème} brigade d'artillerie de campagne a fait preuve d'un remarquable et continuel courage pendant les opérations de Pozières. Le 21 août 1916, cet officier a fourni des informations primordiales sur la configuration réelle de la ligne tenue par nos troupes au Nord-Est de Pozières au lieu-dit la ferme du Mouquet. Ces informations ont été cruciales pour la mise en œuvre des barrages d'artillerie. Il a fourni*

d'excellents rapports et s'est toujours porté volontaire pour ces missions qu'il a exécuté sous un feu ennemi particulièrement nourri ». La bataille de la Ferme du Mouquet qui a commencé le 8 août 1916 est un haut-lieu de la bataille de la Somme et de la bataille de Pozières. La ferme sera prise le 27 septembre 1916 après de très lourdes pertes chez les australiens et les canadiens. Lorsque la roi George V remet la Military Cross, il remarque que Blake porte le ruban de la médaille polaire, et intrigué, il engage pendant 20 minutes une discussion avec lui sur ses expéditions en Antarctique. On sait qu'ensuite Blake enverra sa médaille à sa ancée. Dépêches Magazine, bulletin d'information de l'armée, fait également mention des faits d'armes de Blake en janvier 1917 pour s'être distingué sur le front de l'Ouest. Il sera blessé à plusieurs reprises et notamment le 25 septembre 1917 où un éclat d'obus lui sectionnera des tendons et emportera une partie de son bras droit. Cette blessure était suf samment grave pour qu'il soit déclaré invalide et ainsi pouvoir repartir chez lui, mais Blake refuse et repart au front, après d'âpres négociations. Le 2 octobre 1918, le Capitaine Blake sera de nouveau touché par un éclat d'obus qui provoquera sa mort au petit matin. Il repose aujourd'hui dans le cimetière de Tincourt, plot 5, rangée J.



The Story of Leslie Russel Blake.

Leslie Russel Blake was born October 28, 1890 in Hawthorn, Melbourne in the state of Victoria. After the early death of his parents in 1892 and 1897, he was raised by his aunt, Jane Deazeley in the State of Queensland. He spent his schooling in Brisbane and Sydney University before being appointed as an expert in Geology in the Queensland mines department. He spent most of his time exploring the vast areas of Queensland and major gold regions of the Gympie Region. In 1911, he joined the team of Douglas Mawson who undertook an expedition to Antarctica in order to study and map Macquarie Island. The results of this work which lasted for over two years on this island in extremely difficult circumstances, was the presentation of the King George V Polar Silver Medal. This is a very high distinction that rewards men who lead study or work in Antarctica. Since its creation in 1857, only 245 polar silver medals have been issued. Leslie was a worthy part of the team.

Upon his return from this expedition in 1914, he was asked by Sir Ernest Shackleton, now regarded as a great heroic figure of the periods of exploration in Antarctica, to join the Imperial Trans-Antarctic Shipping 1914/1916. This proposal would stop Blake from entering into the military to serve his country.

Blake made several attempts to join the military but was always declared unfit for combat. After a brief hospital stay, he was finally drafted into the artillery on August 4, 1915.

His abilities and skills were quickly recognized and he was promoted to Sergeant just three months after his engagement with immersion on the battlefield. Four months later on March 12, 1916, after a brief service in the Middle East, he arrived in France as a second lieutenant.

On November 25, 1916, the London Gazette announced that Lieutenant Leslie Russel Blake would receive the Military Cross, which is one of the highest military awards, created by King George V on December 28, 1915. He sent his medal back to his fiancée in Australia. The report from the Australian division is detailed and the states of services which led to this award report that "Lieutenant Leslie Russel Blake, 105th Howitzer Battery of the 5th Field Artillery Brigade has demonstrated a remarkable and continuous courage during the operation of Pozières. August 21, 1916. He provided vital information on the actual configuration of the line held by our troops in the North East of Pozières in the locality Mouquet Farm. This information was crucial to the implementation of artillery barrages. He held excellent relationships with others and always volunteered for the missions he performed under enemy fire especially the most dangerous ones. The battle of Mouquet Farm which started August 8, 1916 was a landmark of the Battle of the Somme and the Battle of Pozieres. The farm was taken on September 27, 1916 after heavy losses were suffered in the Australian and Canadian camps.

When King George V presented the Military Cross, he noted that Blake carried the ribbon of the Polar Medal, and intrigued, he asked about this during a 20 minute a discussion with him on his expeditions in Antarctica. Dispatches Magazine, the Information bulletin of the army, also made mention of Blake's exploits in January 1917 for valor on the Western Front. He was wounded several times, including September 25, 1917 where shrapnel damaged part of his right arm. This injury was sufficiently serious for it to be declared that Blake could go home. Blake refused and went back to the front.

Blake was promoted to Captain in May 1918. After many tough battles. On October 2, 1918, Captain Blake was again hit by German artillery shrapnel at Hargicourt that caused his death at dawn. He was sent to the 58th Casualty Clearing Station where he died the following day aged 27. He now rests in the cemetery of Tincourt, plot 5, row J.

During World war one, Blake surveyed the front line before the Pozieres attack. He never finished writing up his notes because of his sudden death. Blake's work with Mawson was not published until 1943. Blake died 39 days before peace was declared.



CAPTAIN LESLIE R. BLAKE, M.C., who died of wounds in France on October 3. Captain Blake was formerly employed in the Queensland Geological Survey Department, and was a notable figure. He went to the South Pole with Dr. Mawson's expedition, receiving the Polar Medal for distinguished service, and Cape Blake in Antarctica was named after him by Sir Douglas Mawson. Shortly after war broke out he enlisted in the artillery, and left in November, 1915, as a sergeant, gaining his commission on the field.

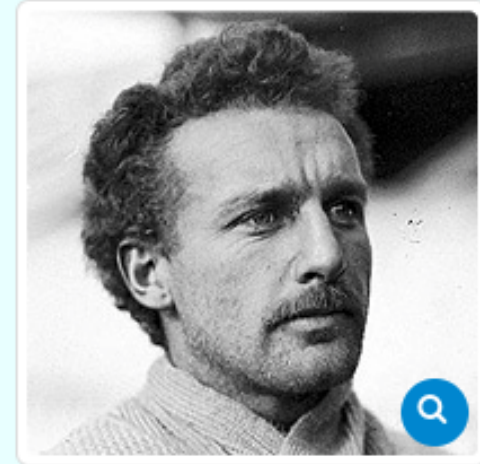


